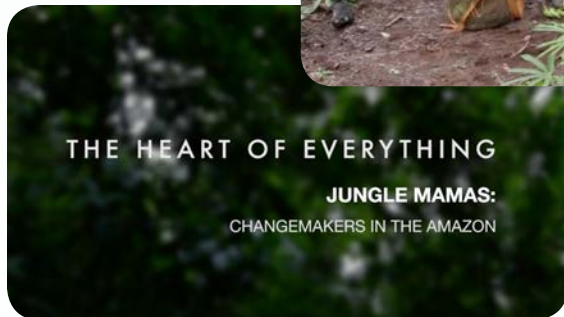
As we begin to say a fond farewell to 2015, we wanted to update you on all our accomplishments over this past year and share with you our plans for the future.

Over the past year, we have welcomed a new Executive Director, and recruited a talented and devoted Board of Directors. Working together, we successfully revamped our web site and have launched a social media outreach via Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn and Vimeo.



This spring we completed our first documentary, *The Heart of Everything: Jungle Mamas – Changemakers in the Amazon*, which is available

on our web site in English, Spanish and the Achuar language, native to the Ecuadoran Amazon.



In August, we joined the Coalition for Adolescent Girls, which brings together dozens of international organizations to design, implement and evaluate programs that benefit girls throughout the developing world who are trapped in cycles of poverty.



Our meetings included USAID, World Bank, AGE Africa, Million Women Mentors, Global Campaign for Education, U.S. Department of Education, Brookings Institution, ASCD, Innovations in Civic Participation, NEA Foundation, Creative Associates, and the Coalition for Adolescent Girls. All of these meetings were wonderful and proved very fruitful for us as we continue to build our network and forge partnerships.

In September, we traveled to New York to participate in the United Nations General Assembly meetings addressing issues critical to adolescent girls and young women around the world, especially those in developing countries. We learned about the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and are working to incorporate those goals into work of Girls Thinking Global. While we were in New York, we had the honor of attending the Ford Foundation's *Let Girls Learn* event and the Girls CHARGE event hosted by the Brookings Institute.



We capped off the year as delegates to the annual WISE Summit in Dohar, Qatar, where we learned of many efforts to improve girls' education in some of the most challenging areas of the world.

We also received our much anticipated 501(c)(3) status from the IRS at the end of August, which has helped tremendously with our ability to raise funds and seek grants.
